RESOLUTION 2024-08

THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION OF THE HIGHLAND MEADOWS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ("DISTRICT") RELATING TO THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS AND ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2024 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the District Manager has, prior to the fifteenth (15th) day in June, 2024, submitted to the Board of Supervisors ("**Board**") of the Highland Meadows Community Development District ("**District**") a proposed budget ("**Proposed Budget**") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025 ("**Fiscal Year 2024/2025**"), along with an explanatory and complete financial plan for each fund of the District, pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, at least sixty (60) days prior to the adoption of the Proposed Budget, the District filed a copy of the Proposed Budget with the local governing authorities having jurisdiction over the area included in the District pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(b), *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the Board set a public hearing thereon and caused notice of such public hearing to be given by publication pursuant to Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager posted the Proposed Budget on the District's website at least two days before the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes*, requires that, prior to October 1st of each year, the Board, by passage of the Annual Appropriation Resolution, shall adopt a budget for the ensuing fiscal year and appropriate such sums of money as the Board deems necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during the ensuing fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager has prepared a Proposed Budget, whereby the budget shall project the cash receipts and disbursements anticipated during a given time period, including reserves for contingencies for emergency or other unanticipated expenditures during the fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE HIGHLAND MEADOWS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BUDGET

- a. The Board has reviewed the Proposed Budget, a copy of which is on file with the office of the District Manager and at the District's Local Records Office, and hereby approves certain amendments thereto, as shown in Section 2 below.
- b. The Proposed Budget, attached hereto as **Exhibit "A,"** as amended by the Board, is hereby adopted in accordance with the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes* (**"Adopted Budget"**), and incorporated herein by reference; provided, however, that the comparative figures contained in the Adopted Budget may be subsequently revised as deemed necessary by the District Manager to reflect actual revenues and expenditures.
- c. The Adopted Budget, as amended, shall be maintained in the office of the District Manager and at the District's Local Records Office and identified as "The Budget for the Highland Meadows Community Development District for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2025."
- d. The Adopted Budget shall be posted by the District Manager on the District's official website within thirty (30) days after adoption and shall remain on the website for at least two (2) years.

SECTION 3. BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Pursuant to Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*, the District at any time within Fiscal Year 2024/2025 or within sixty (60) days following the end of the Fiscal Year 2024/2025 may amend its Adopted Budget for that fiscal year as follows:

a. A line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund may be decreased or increased by motion of the Board recorded in the minutes, and approving the expenditure, if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase.

- b. The District Manager or Treasurer may approve an expenditure that would increase or decrease a line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase and if either (i) the aggregate change in the original appropriation item does not exceed the greater of \$15,000 or 15% of the original appropriation, or (ii) such expenditure is authorized by separate disbursement or spending resolution.
- c. Any other budget amendments shall be adopted by resolution and consistent with Florida law.

The District Manager or Treasurer must ensure that any amendments to the budget under paragraph c. above are posted on the District's website within five (5) days after adoption and remain on the website for at least two (2) years.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

REVENUES

Special Assessments- On Roll

The District will levy a Non-Ad Valorem assessment on all sold and platted parcels within the District in order to pay for the operating expenditures during the Fiscal Year.

Misc. Income

Any other income that is not mentioned above.

Expenditures - Administrative

Supervisors Fees

Chapter 190 of the Florida Statutes allows for members of the Board of Supervisors to be compensated \$200 per meeting in which they attend. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is based on all supervisors attending 6 meetings.

FICA Taxes

Payroll taxes on Board of Supervisor's compensation. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is calculated at 7.65% of the total Board of Supervisor's payroll expenditures.

Engineering

The District's engineer, **Dewberry Engineers Inc.** will provide general engineering services to the District, i.e. attendance and preparation for monthly board meetings, review of invoices, and other specifically requested assignments.

Attorney

The District's Attorney, **Kilinski Van Wyk**, **PLCC** will be providing general legal services to the District, i.e., attendance and preparation for monthly Board meetings, review of contracts, review of agreements and resolutions, and other research assigned as directed by the Board of Supervisors and the District Manager.

Annual Audit

The District is required to conduct an annual audit of its financial records by an Independent Certified Public Accounting Firm. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is based on contracted fees from the previous year engagement with **Grau and Associates** plus anticipated increase.

Assessment Administration - Admin

GMS CF, LLC provides assessment services for closing lot sales, assessment roll services with the local Tax Collector and financial advisory services.

Assessment Administration - County

Polk County charges 1% of the roll to include the CDD assessments on the County tax roll.

Trustee Fees

The District bonds will be held and administered by a Trustee at U.S. Bank. This represents the trustee annual fee.

Management Fees

The District receives Management, Accounting and Administrative services as part of a Management Agreement with Governmental Management Services-Central Florida, LLC. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is based on the contracted fees outlined in Exhibit "A" of the Management Agreement.

Expenditures - Administrative (continued)

Website Maintenance

Per Chapter 2014-22, Laws of Florida, all Districts must have a website to provide detailed information on the CDD as well as links to useful websites regarding Compliance issues. This website will be maintained by GMS-CF, LLC and updated monthly.

Postage and Delivery

Actual postage and/or freight used for District mailings including agenda packages, vendor checks and other correspondence.

Insurance General Liability

The District's General Liability & Public Officials Liability Insurance policy is with a qualified entity that specializes in providing insurance coverage to governmental agencies. The amount is based upon similar Community Development Districts.

Printing and Binding

Copies used in the preparation of agenda packages, required mailings, and other special projects.

Legal Advertising

The District is required to advertise various notices for monthly Board meetings and other public hearings in a newspaper of general circulation.

Other Current Charges

This includes monthly bank charges and any other miscellaneous expenses that incur during the year.

Due, Licenses & Subscriptions

The District is required to pay an annual fee to the Department of Economic Opportunity Community Affairs for \$175.

Expenditures – Field

Field Management Services

The District has contracted with GMS-CF, LLC for the onsite management, contract administration and vendor oversite.

RESOLUTION 2024-09

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE HIGHLAND MEADOWS **COMMUNITY** DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT MAKING Α BENEFIT DETERMINATION OF AND IMPOSING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024/2025; PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION AND ENFORCEMENT SPECIAL OF **ASSESSMENTS**; **CERTIFYING AN ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING FOR** AMENDMENTS TO THE ASSESSMENT **ROLL:** PROVIDING **SEVERABILITY** AND Α CLAUSE; **PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the Highland Meadows Community Development District ("**District**") is a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, for the purpose of providing, operating and maintaining infrastructure improvements, facilities and services to the lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, the District is located in Polk County, Florida ("County"); and

WHEREAS, the District has constructed or acquired various infrastructure improvements and provides certain services in accordance with the District's adopted capital improvement plan and Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the District hereby determines to undertake various operations and maintenance and other activities described in the District's budget ("Adopted Budget") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025 ("Fiscal Year 2024/2025"), attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, the District must obtain sufficient funds to provide for the operation and maintenance of the services and facilities provided by the District as described in the Adopted Budget; and

WHEREAS, the provision of such services, facilities, and operations is a benefit to lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, provides that the District may impose special assessments on benefitted lands within the District; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the District to proceed with the imposition of the special assessments for operations and maintenance in the amount set forth in the Adopted Budget; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 197, Florida Statutes, provides a mechanism pursuant to which such

special assessments may be placed on the tax roll and collected by the local tax collector ("**Uniform Method**"), and the District has previously authorized the use of the Uniform Method by, among other things, entering into agreements with the Property Appraiser and Tax Collector of the County for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the District to adopt the Assessment Roll of the Highland Meadows Community Development District ("Assessment Roll") attached to this Resolution as Exhibit "B" and incorporated as a material part of this Resolution by this reference, and to certify the Assessment Roll to the County Tax Collector pursuant to the Uniform Method; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the District to permit the District Manager to amend the Assessment Roll, certified to the County Tax Collector by this Resolution, as the Property Appraiser updates the property roll for the County, for such time as authorized by Florida law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE HIGHLAND MEADOWS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BENEFIT & ALLOCATION FINDINGS. The Board hereby finds and determines that the provision of the services, facilities, and operations as described in **Exhibit "A"** confers a special and peculiar benefit to the lands within the District, which benefit exceeds or equals the cost of the assessments. The allocation of the assessments to the specially benefitted lands, as shown in **Exhibits "A" and "B,"** is hereby found to be fair and reasonable.

SECTION 2. ASSESSMENT IMPOSITION. Pursuant to Chapters 190 and 197, *Florida Statutes*, and using the procedures authorized by Florida law for the levy and collection of special assessments, a special assessment for operation and maintenance is hereby imposed and levied on benefitted lands within the District, and in accordance with **Exhibits "A" and "B."** The lien of the special assessments for operations and maintenance imposed and levied by this Resolution shall be effective upon passage of this Resolution. Moreover, pursuant to Section 197.3632(4), *Florida Statutes*, the lien amount shall serve as the "maximum rate" authorized by law for operation and maintenance assessments.

SECTION 3. COLLECTION. The collection of the operation and maintenance special assessments shall be at the same time and in the same manner as County taxes in accordance with the Uniform Method, as indicated on **Exhibits "A" and "B."** The decision to collect special assessments by any particular method – e.g., on the tax roll or by direct bill – does not mean that such method will be used to collect special assessments in future years, and the District reserves the right in its sole discretion to select collection methods in any given year, regardless of past practices.

SECTION 4. ASSESSMENT ROLL. The Assessment Roll, attached to this Resolution as **Exhibit "B,"** is hereby certified to the County Tax Collector and shall be collected by the County Tax Collector in the same manner and time as County taxes. The proceeds therefrom shall be paid

to the District.

SECTION 5. ASSESSMENT ROLL AMENDMENT. The District Manager shall keep apprised of all updates made to the County property roll by the Property Appraiser after the date of this Resolution, and shall amend the Assessment Roll in accordance with any such updates, for such time as authorized by Florida law, to the County property roll. After any amendment of the Assessment Roll, the District Manager shall file the updates in the District records.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Resolution shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Resolution, or any part thereof.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect upon the passage and adoption of this Resolution by the Board.

Ms. Adams stated the Board can appoint a qualified elector for Seat #1. She noted they must be at least 18 years of age, a resident of the United States, a resident of the state of Florida, live within the boundaries of Highland Meadows, and are a registered voter with Polk Elections office.

After discussion the Board made a recommendation for Kevin Serrano to be appointed to Seat #1. Mr. Serrano's background and qualifications were discussed and verified.

On MOTION by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Eric Chenowith, with all in favor, to Appoint Mr. Kevin Serrano to Seat #1 which Expires in November 2026, was approved.

C. Administration of Oath of Office to Newly Appointed Supervisor

Ms. Adams, a Florida Notary duly authorized administered the Oath of Office to Mr. Serrano. She added there will be additional information (including completing Form 1) provided to him. She explained the requirement to complete the Ethics training. District Counsel reviewed key guidelines for Florida Sunshine Laws.

Ms. Adams noted they will provide the guide on the sunshine amendment and code of ethics for public officers and employees. Ms. Adams reviewed the compensation for the Board, and it was noted Mr. Serrano accepted.

D. Consideration of Resolution 2024-02 Electing Officers

Ms. Adams stated upon a new seat appointment the Board is required to elect new officers with Resolution 2024-04. She reviewed the current lineup of officers as Ms. Cindy Chenowith as Chair, and other Board members serving as assistant secretaries.

Ms. Chenowith suggested appointing Mr. Oliver as Vice Chair. The motion for the new slate of Officers will be Ms. Chenowith as Chair, Mr. Oliver as Vice Chair and other Board Members as Assistant Secretaries. She noted Jill Burns would be Secretary, Ms. Tricia Adams, as Assistant Secretary, and Mr. Flint as Treasurer and other members of the accounting team will be other officers.

On MOTION by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Oliver, with all in favor, Resolution 2024-02 Election of Officers will be Ms. Chenowith as Chair, Mr. Oliver as Vice Chairman, Mr. Chenowith and Mr. Serrano as the Assistant Secretaries, with other Staff Members as Officers, was approved.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Approval of Minutes of the November 17, 2023 and December 8, 2023 Board of Supervisors Meeting

Ms. Adams presented the minutes of the November 17, 2023, and December 8, 2023, Board of Supervisors meetings. She noted they had been reviewed by District counsel and District management.

On MOTION by Mr. Eric Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Serrano, with all in favor, the Minutes of the November 17, 2023, and the December 8, 2023, Board of Supervisors Meetings, were approved.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Resolution 2024-03 Approving the Fiscal Year 2025 Proposed Budget and Setting a Public Hearing to Approved Budget

Ms. Adams stated this resolution is the Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 proposed budget and setting a public hearing to adopt the budget. She noted the proposed budget is required to be approved by June 15 each year. She reviewed the budget for fiscal year FY2025 to begin October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2025. She suggested the public hearing for the August meeting date. She noted approval of the proposed budget sets the cap on operations and maintenance assessment for FY2025.

Ms. Adams stated approval of the resolution approves the proposed budget and sets the public hearing for August 23, 2024, at 2:00 p.m. at the Lake Alfred Public Library. She noted this resolution allows for the transmittal of the budget to the local governments, to post the budget to the CDD website, and to notice the budget hearing in accordance with Florida Statutes.

Ms. Adams reviewed the budget to include the general fund revenues, general fund expenses, the capital reserve fund, and collection of the bond debt fees. Staff reviewed current expenditures and spending projections. The district receives CDD maintenance assessments which are collected on the annual Polk County property tax bill. She noted the gross assessment amount assumes property owners will receive the early payment discount and accounts for fees collected by Polk County and the net assessment is what the District will receive.

Past budgets and the process for estimating a proposed budget was discussed to include legal services. Mr. Chenowith preferred that one-time legal expenses such as the litigation costs to defend sovereign citizen claims not be budgeted in the regular attorney fee line item. Based on discussion, Ms. Adams stated it sounded like the Board would like to put in \$15,000 for the 2025 budget for general legal fees and \$5,000 for legal contingency fees so that change will be made.

Ms. Adams further explained the general and administrative budgeting include the expenses to operate the district in accordance with Florida Statutes and in compliance with the bond trust indenture. She explained the proposed amounts for field expenses include the costs to maintain the district's infrastructure and common areas.

She added there are 222 units in the Highland Meadows CDD. The proposed budget shows a \$30,000 contribution for the Capital Reserve Fund. Board members were concerned that the Capital Reserve Fund had been depleted and that the roads will need to be replaced in the near future. The Board discussed reserve funds and estimated costs for road repairs. Ms. Chenowith proposed to increase the assessments in order to increase capital reserve funding, and suggested an increase of \$400 per unit. Other Board members were concerned about the increase. She suggested to meet in the middle with a \$300 increase per unit.

After discussion the Board made the decision to propose an increase the operations and maintenance assessments by \$300 per unit.

On MOTION by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Serrano, with Ms. Cindy Chenowith, Mr. Serrano, and Mr. Oliver in favor and Mr. Eric Chenowith opposed, Resolution 2024-03 Approving the Fiscal Year 2025 Proposed Budget and Sets the Public Hearing for August 23, 2024, at 2:00 p.m. at the Lake Alfred Public Library, was approved as amended 3-1.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Resolution 2024-04 Related to the General Election and Qualifying Period Procedures

Ms. Adams stated this resolution clarifies there are three seats in the general election. These include Seat #3, Seat #4 and Seat #5. The qualifying period is facilitated by the Polk Elections office starting a 12:00 (noon) June 10th through noon on June 14, 2024. She announced the Seat #4 is currently held by Cindy Chenowith, Seat #3 is held by Eric Chenowith, and Seat #5 is held by Headley Oliver.

On MOTION by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Oliver, with all in favor, Resolution 2024-04 Related to the General Election and Qualifying Period, was approved.

SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Resolution 2024-05 Appointing Assistant Treasurer & Assistant Secretaries

Ms. Adams stated this item will be removed from the agenda because it was taken care of with the election of officers.

EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Resolution 2024-06 Updating Local Bank Account Signatories Ms. Adams stated this resolution appoints the Treasurer the Assistant Treasurer and Secretaries and signers on the District's bank account.

On MOTION by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Eric Chenowith, with all in favor, Resolution 2024-06 Updating Local Bank Account Signatories, was approved.

NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Resolution 2024-07 Establishing Account with the State Board Administration

Ms. Adams stated this resolution is required to invest your surplus funds and reserve funds in the highest interest-bearing account possible. She noted the district has adopted investment guidelines and stated they were eligible to participate in four investment options. One option is State Board of Administration which is a Florida government investment pool earning 5.6% and the funds were 100% liquid.

She noted approval of the resolution will authorize staff to open the State Board of Administration (SBA) account. She also reviewed other investment options such as Money Market or Certificates of Deposit. Ms. Chenowith preferred a fixed rate. She stated she wanted the money to be more insured and at lower risk. She asked the Board for their thoughts. After discussion the Board declined to open a State Board account. They made a motion to open a money market account. It was noted this would be at Bank United.

On MOTION by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Serrano, with all in favor, Authorization to Open a Money Market Account, was approved.

TENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Ratification of Contract Agreement with Polk County Property Appraiser

Ms. Adams stated this contract agreement for the upcoming 2024 tax year assessment with the property appraiser in Polk County. She added this is required each year.

On MOTION by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Eric Chenowith, with all in favor, the Contract Agreement with Polk County Property Appraiser, was ratified.

ELEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Acceptance of Ranking of the Audit Committee and Authorizing Staff to Send Notice of Intent to Award Number 1 Ranked Firm

Ms. Adams stated this accepts the ranking of the Audit Committee to rank Grau & Associates as #1 and will authorize staff to send the notice of intent for the 5-year agreement.

On MOTION by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Eric Chenowith, with all in favor, Accepting the Ranking of the Audit Committee to Authorizing Staff to Send Notice of Intent to Award #1 Ranked Firm Grau & Associates, was approved.

*The Board took a five-minute recess at this time.

TWELFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Staff Reports

A. Attorney

Mr. Van Wyk stated they had the litigation issue coming up. The next hearing with the Judge on the litigation matter is on June 25th at 11:30 am. This will be done by Zoom. He commented the purpose of the motion of the litigation is to dismiss the case completely. He added the Davenport police department has requested interlocal agreements for traffic enforcement in the CDD. He explained the process. He stated that the ethics training needed to be completed.

B. Engineer

Mr. Arrington stated that he had nothing to report. The question was asked how much the cost would be for milling and resurfacing in the neighborhood. He noted this cost would be near the same as the prior estimate for Highland Meadows with a slight increase for costs. Mr. Chenowith asked how much linear distance of roadwork exists. He responded he would follow-up with an answer. Ms. Adams asked about the action item list update on construction plans for a

neighboring parcel outside of Highland Meadows Place cul de sac. He responded that he will follow-up.

C. Field Manager's Report

i. Consideration of Landscape Enhancement Proposals from Prince & Sons

Mr. Blanco presented the Field Manager's Report to include the wall repairs, picked up the debris from the crash, review of the perimeter wall, reinforcement of storm water ponds, reinforcement of the retention wall that had washout issues, and moving of pavers. Discussion ensued on preventing the resident taking the pavers. Also reviewed was the replacement of monument lights with LED lights, other repairs to street signs, replacement of electrical meter, combination lock replacement, Highland Meadows lettering painting with black gloss, landscaping review with new landscaper vendor with Prince & Sons.

He reviewed the proposals for sprucing up landscaping and mulching. He noted at the next meeting he will bring a proposal for tree trimming. Mr. Chenowith asked a question about spending on mulching, and it was noted nothing had been spent this year. The new budget was discussed and the allowance for mulching.

Mr. Blanco stated the proposals for mulching and sprucing up entrances. Discussion ensued on the costs for all proposals for mulching at both locations for \$2,900, washout concerns and losing the mulching, the request for fill dirt. Bird of Paradise are aesthetically pleasing with the planting, vendor will use color to enhance the signs, weeding, types of plantings of flowers, problems with plants dying, timeline, and budget concerns at this time. The current budget is \$8,150, and the estimate is for \$10,535. Ms. Chenowith questioned if they are \$2,000 short should they proceed. Discussion ensued on the need for this updating for mulching and refreshing.

After discussion the Board decided to proceed with the proposal with an amendment to adjust the wording of the mulching and landscaping.

On MOTION by Mr. Eric Chenowith, seconded by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, with all in favor, the Proposals from Prince and Sons for Landscape Enhancements, were approved as amended.

D. District Manager's Report

i. Action Items

Ms. Adams stated the legal letter to the property owner was completed. The Field Manager is reviewing property for seeding. She stated the Engineer updates on a particular area, and noted the ethics training is on-going with several Board members. She explained the free links for the training videos were provided by the attorney. They have transition to a new vendor for landscaping and proposals for maintenance will be provided as needed. The HOA has been contacted to ensure they have a current CDD contact.

ii. Approval of Check Register

Ms. Adams stated the check register is for items in the general fund from October 1, 2023, through March 31, 2024. Ms. Chenowith ask for a new W-2.

On MOTION by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Serrano, with all in favor, the Check Register, was approved.

iii. Balance Sheet and Income Statement

Ms. Adams reviewed the unaudited financials for the combined balance sheets and the unassigned balance. She explained the formatting for the balance sheets to include reserves, expenditures and other items. She noted the prorated budget for administration of the district as of March 31st was \$49,459. They had spent \$48,878. She noted there is no action required by the Board.

iv. Presentation of Registered Voters – 373

Ms. Adams stated the number of registered voters in the district was 373 as of April 15, 2024. This is required each year. She explained the process of transitioning from landowner election to landowner election. This process has been completed.

THIRTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Meeting Scheduled (ADDED)

This was discussed earlier in the meeting. The Board has requested to move the meeting schedule for next fiscal year from Fridays to any Tuesday of the month.

FOURTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Other Business

There being no comments, the next item followed.

FIFTHTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Supervisor

There being no comments, the next item followed.

SIXTENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Ms. Adams asked for a motion to adjourn.

On MOTION by Ms. Cindy Chenowith, seconded by Mr. Oliver, with all in favor, the meeting was adjourned.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE HIGHLAND MEADOWS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT DECLARING A VACANCY IN SEATS 3, 4 AND 5 ON THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS PURSUANT TO SECTION 190.006(3)(b), *FLORIDA STATUTES*; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Highland Meadows Community Development District ("**District**") is a local unit of special-purpose government created and existing pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, on November 5, 2024, three (3) members of the Board of Supervisors ("Board") are to be elected by the "Qualified Electors" of the District, as that term is defined in Section 190.003, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the District published a notice of qualifying period set by the Supervisor of Elections at least two (2) weeks prior to the start of said qualifying period; and

WHEREAS, at the close of the qualifying period there were no Qualified Electors qualified to run for three (3) of the seats available for election by the Qualified Electors of the District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 190.006(3)(b), *Florida Statutes*, the Board shall declare the seats vacant, effective the second Tuesday following the general election; and

WHEREAS, Qualified Electors are to be appointed to the vacant seats within 90 days thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that it is in the best interests of the District to adopt this Resolution declaring the seats available for election as vacant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE HIGHLAND MEADOWS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

1. DECLARATION OF VACANT BOARD SUPERVISOR SEATS. The following seats are hereby declared vacant effective as of November 19, 2024:

Seat #3 (currently held by Eric Chenowith) Seat #4 (currently held by Cindy Chenowith) Seat #5 (currently held by Headley Oliver)

2. INCUMBENT BOARD SUPERVISORS. Until such time as the Board

nominates Qualified Electors to fill the vacancies declared in Section 1 above, the incumbent Board Supervisors of those respective seats shall remain in office.

3. SEVERABILITY. The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Resolution shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Resolution, or any part thereof.

4. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall become effective upon its passage.

SECTION VII

CITY OF DAVENPORT, FLORIDA/HIGHLAND MEADOWS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT TRAFFIC CONTROL JURISDICTION AGREEMENT

This Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the **City of Davenport, Florida**, a municipal corporation created under the laws of the State of Florida (hereafter "CITY"), and **Highland Meadows Community Development District**, an independent special district created by ordinance pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes (hereafter "DISTRICT").

RECITALS

1. The Highland Meadows Community Development District is a local unit of special-purpose government and an independent special district established pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, and by Ordinance No. 573 enacted by the CITY on April 24, 2006, as amended by Ordinance No. 585 on February 21, 2007 as amended by Ordinance No. 615, enacted by the CITY on April 9, 2007, respectively.

2. The DISTRICT owns fee simple title to all the roadways lying within the DISTRICT boundaries (hereafter "District Roads") and the boundaries and location of the DISTRICT is described and illustrated in Exhibit "A" attached to and incorporated in this Agreement.

3. The DISTRICT has requested that the CITY exercise its discretion under Section 316.006, Florida Statutes, and other applicable laws to exercise municipal traffic control jurisdiction over the DISTRICT Roads pursuant to written agreement.

4. A quorum of the Board of Supervisors of the DISTRICT (the "Board") has met, and a majority of the members of the Board approved the execution of this Agreement.

5. The Florida Legislature, by enacting Section 316.006(2)(b), Florida Statutes, has authorized municipalities to exercise jurisdiction over special district roads if a municipality and the party owning such roads and common areas enter into a written agreement providing traffic control jurisdiction to the municipality and the governing body of the municipality approves that agreement.

6. The DISTRICT desires the CITY to enforce the traffic laws of the State of Florida over the DISTRICT Roads.

7. The CITY approves the exercise of municipal traffic control jurisdiction by the City of Davenport Police Department over the DISTRICT Roads.

8. The parties now desire to set forth the terms and conditions of this Agreement and acknowledge and agree that each is bound by such Agreement.

ACCORDINGLY, in consideration of the above stated Recitals, and other good and valuable consideration the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the parties, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated in and form a material part of this Agreement.

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Authority, Jurisdiction & Access</u>. Pursuant to section 316.006(2)(b), Florida Statutes, and its home rule powers, the CITY agrees to exercise traffic control jurisdiction over the District Roads by providing enforcement of the traffic laws of the state upon the DISTRICT Roads during normal patrol hours (hereafter "Services"). Should the DISTRICT desire the CITY to be situated in its boundaries at times outside normal patrol hours, the DISTRICT understands that a separate contract shall be executed for additional services. The DISTRICT will provide the CITY with access to the DISTRICT Roads so that the CITY may carry out the Services under this Agreement.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Term of Agreement.</u> The term of this Agreement shall commence on ______, and continue through ______, and shall thereafter automatically continue for successive one-year terms unless terminated by either party by provision of ten (10) days written notice to the other party. The provisions of Section 10 herein shall survive the termination of this Agreement as well as any and all subsequent amended agreements entered into by the parties hereto.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Signage.</u> Prior to any traffic enforcement action, the DISTRICT, in consultation with the City of Davenport Police Department, shall establish the speed limit for the roads within the DISTRICT boundaries. The DISTRICT shall be responsible for posting the speed limit and erecting other traffic signs along the DISTRICT Roads in compliance with State of Florida Department of Transportation requirements. The maintenance, repair, and posting of all signage within the DISTRICT boundaries shall always be solely and exclusively the responsibility of the DISTRICT. The DISTRICT shall provide the CITY with certification by a licensed engineer that the roadway signage is in accordance with the standards set forth in the *Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices* and Chapter 316, Florida Statutes.

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Authority in Addition to Existing Authority.</u> The CITY's exercise of traffic control jurisdiction pursuant to this Agreement shall be supplemental to the authority presently enjoyed by the CITY over such roads and the DISTRICT, and nothing herein shall be construed to limit or modify such preexisting authority. The CITY agrees to continue to provide such police services as are required by law. This Agreement does not limit the DISTRICT's authority as prescribed by Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, in any manner.

<u>Section 6.</u> <u>Compensation.</u> If the DISTRICT is interested in additional neighborhood patrols or any special details, they shall be responsible for compensating the CITY for these off-duty services pursuant to this Agreement at an hourly rate and in a manner specified in Exhibit "B," which is attached hereto and incorporated herein. The hourly rate

shall remain in effect until such time as it is revised in accordance with the CITY or departmental policy or procedure, ordinance or any other applicable statute, law or regulation.

<u>Section 7.</u> <u>City To Retain Revenues.</u> All revenue from the fines, costs and penalties imposed by the traffic citations issued for violation of traffic laws on the DISTRICT Roads shall be solely retained by the CITY and apportioned in the manner set forth in applicable statutes. All revenue from the fines, costs, and penalties and/or liens, and the liens themselves that may be imposed on property located within the DISTRICT, shall be solely retained/owned by the CITY.

<u>Section 8.</u> <u>Liability Not Increased</u>. Neither the existence of this Agreement nor anything contained herein shall give rise to any greater liability on the part of the CITY than that which the CITY would ordinarily be subjected to when providing police services.

<u>Section 9.</u> <u>Remedies.</u> Although the City of Davenport Police Department will diligently attempt to provide the DISTRICT with the Services specified within this Agreement, the CITY's failure to do so shall not constitute a breach of this Agreement, nor shall any penalty be imposed therefore.

Section 10. Hold Harmless and Indemnification By The DISTRICT. To the fullest extent permitted by law, and only up to, and without waiving, the monetary limitations of liability and sovereign immunity protections set forth in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, the DISTRICT agrees to hold harmless and shall indemnify the CITY, each of its Commission Members, employees, appointees, officers and agents, both individually and in each of their official capacities from any and all claims, and manners of action or actions, cause and causes of action, lawsuits, trespasses, damages, judgments, executions, claims, liabilities and demands whatsoever, in law or in equity including, reasonable attorney's fees for any action or inaction arising out of, related to or deriving from, either directly or indirectly, any matter, action taken, or inaction by the City within the scope or furtherance of this Agreement.

Section 11. Insurance. To ensure its ability to fulfill the obligations pursuant to Section 10, above, the DISTRICT, as a condition precedent to the CITY's assumption of traffic control and enforcement jurisdiction as specified in this Agreement shall obtain an insurance policy in a sufficient amount for officers and directors liability, and for Comprehensive Automobile Liability. The DISTRICT shall also obtain general liability insurance for the term of this Agreement in the amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), Comprehensive General Liability and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) in the aggregate. Said policy or policies of insurance shall: (a) name the CITY as an additional insured as it relates to the activities conducted pursuant to this Agreement, (b) be issued by companies authorized to do business under the laws of the State of Florida, (c) shall not exclude police liability, and (d) otherwise be acceptable to the City. Upon receiving notice of the acceptability of said policy or policies, the DISTRICT shall always file and maintain current certificates of the required insurance with the CITY. Any cancellations or lapses of insurance coverage affecting directly or indirectly the

provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed a material breach, and the CITY shall have the right, in its sole discretion, to terminate this Agreement and seek applicable damages or other judicial relief.

<u>Section 12</u>. <u>Road Maintenance.</u> Neither the existence of this Agreement nor anything contained herein shall impose any obligation or duty upon the CITY to provide maintenance for and/or drainage of the DISTRICT Roads. The maintenance, repair and construction or reconstruction of all roads, drainage and signage within the DISTRICT shall always be solely and exclusively the responsibility of the DISTRICT.

<u>Section 13.</u> <u>Assignability.</u> The DISTRICT may not assign its rights nor delegate its duties and obligations arising under this Agreement except by the express, written consent of the CITY.

<u>Section 14.</u> <u>Termination.</u> Should either party to this Agreement desire to terminate the Agreement, the party wishing to terminate the Agreement must provide written notice thereof to the other party no less than ten (10) calendar days prior to the intended termination date.

Section 15. Notices. All notices contemplated by this Agreement shall be given in writing and sent by certified mail, return receipt requested to the following:

Section 17. Costs or Expenses. Any costs or expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) associated with enforcement of the terms and/or conditions of this Agreement shall be borne by the respective parties hereto.

<u>Section 18.</u> <u>Application of Public Records.</u> Notwithstanding anything contained herein, as provided under Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, both parties are subject to the provisions of Florida's Public Records Law.

Section 19. Amendments. The parties hereto agree that no modification, amendment or alteration in the terms and conditions contained herein shall be effective unless contained in a written document executed with the same formality and of equal dignity herewith.

Section 20. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement of the parties hereto and is intended as a complete and exclusive statement of the promises, representations, negotiations, discussions, and agreements that have been made in connection with the subject of the Agreement.

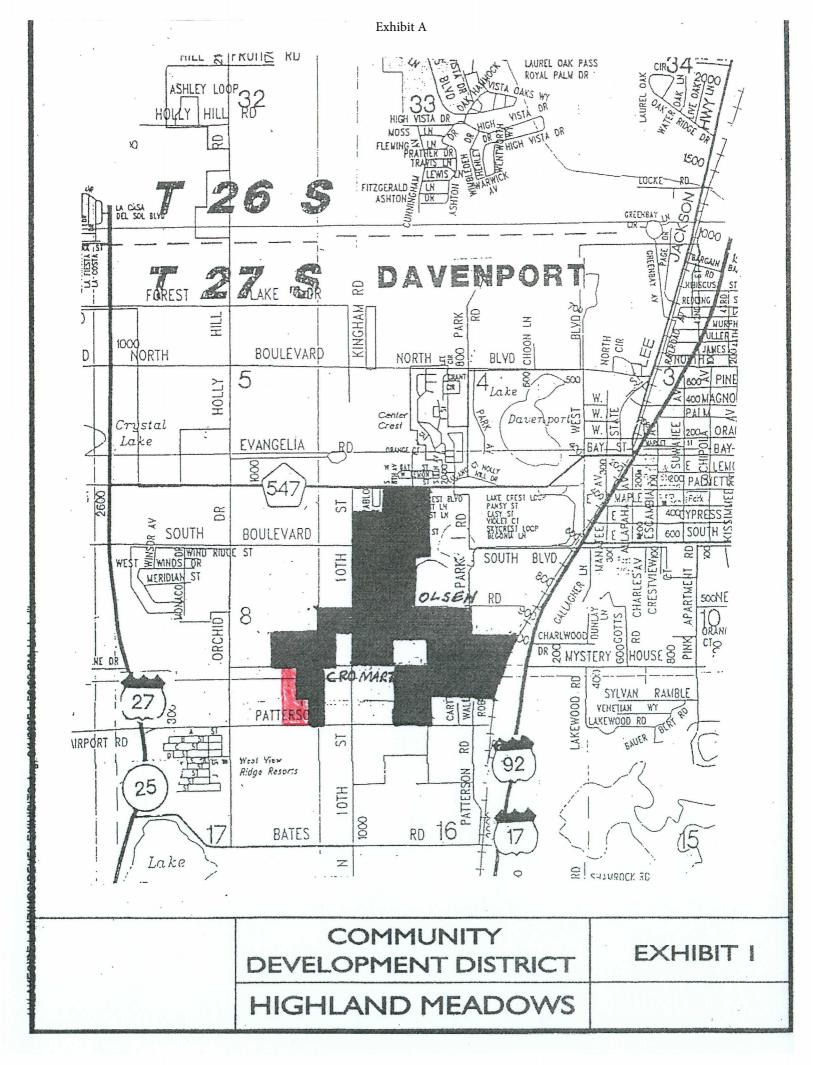

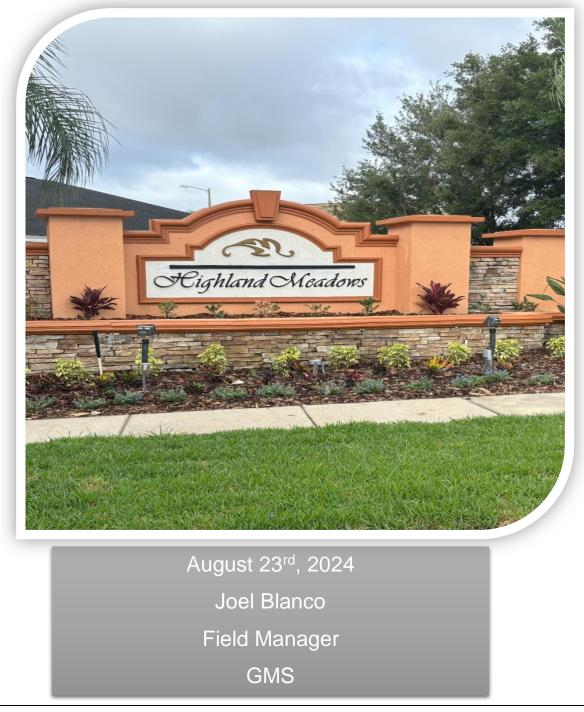

Highland Meadows CDD Field Management Report



Completed

Repair Swale on 236 Highland Meadows Dr.

- GMS staff was notified of a developing hole on the swale of 236 Highland Meadows Dr.
- Field Staff reviewed the hole, notified Davenport Utilities to check meter as a potential cause. Area was dry with no leak at the meter.
- Staff reviewed inlets close to the swale area with District Engineer recommending CCTV since drain runs underneath the sidewalk.
- CCTV was completed by vendor with report showing no excessive sediment and recommendation to backfill area.
- Maintenance staff backfilled area and laid sod.
- Field Staff has reviewed areas after heavy rain. Area is intact with grass flourishing.



Completed

Landscaping Enhancements at Entrances

- The board approved landscaping enhancements at both entrances and frontage at the last meeting.
- Landscaping vendor removed all plantings and dead grass not a part of the new layout.
- Existing Birds of Paradise palms were moved to the sides, lantanas were planted in the front bed, blue daze in the flower bed by the community signs with crotons on flower bed ends.
- Sod was added to the swale areas next to the entrances on both Davenport Blvd. and Olsen Rd.
- Plants have thrived since installation. Requesting additional detailing to both entrance landscaping.
- Pine bark mulch was added at both frontages to match new mulch in the entrances.

Repair Collapsed Inlet Lip at the corner of 237 Highland Meadows Dr.



- Field Staff identified a collapsed inlet lip that collapsed at the corner of 237 Highland Meadows Dr.
- Maintenance Staff lifted lip and reinforced lip with high strength sakrete and PVC tubes with ends reinforced with additional sakrete.
- Inlet was reviewed after heavy rain. Inlet remains in great conditions.

Pond Reviews

- GMS staff reviewed previously repaired stormwater structures at the start of the rain season
- Outlets are dispersing collected water at a healthy rate with no evidence of washouts, sediment, or vegetation in the outlets.
- Ponds remain in good conditions (mowed with stormwater structures functional



In Progress

Sidewalk Review

- Field Services conducted a sidewalk review of the entire district.
 21 sections throughout the community has lifted sidewalk slabs and/or deep structural cracks.
 Attached is a proposal from GMS
 - to grind down lift sidewalk slabs and repair slabs with deep cracks.



In Progress

Tree Trimming at both Frontages

- During Landscape Review, Field Services noted that oaks, magnolia trees, and palms at the frontage and entrances were overgrown and in need of an annual trim.
- Attached is an estimate to trim 15 oaks on frontage of Davenport Blvd. median going into Davenport Blvd., and frontage on Olsen Rd., 5 magnolias on Olsen Rd., and 8 palms in need of seed pod removal.
- Oaks are the most overgrown out of the three.

RE: HB7013 – Special Districts Performance Measures and Standards

To enhance accountability and transparency, new regulations were established for all special districts, by the Florida Legislature, during their 2024 legislative session. Starting on October 1, 2024, or by the end of the first full fiscal year after its creation (whichever comes later), each special district must establish goals and objectives for each program and activity, as well as develop performance measures and standards to assess the achievement of these goals and objectives. Additionally, by December 1 each year (initial report due on December 1, 2025), each special district is required to publish an annual report on its website, detailing the goals and objectives achieved, the performance measures and standards used, and any goals or objectives that were not achieved.

District Management has identified the following key categories to focus on for Fiscal Year 2025 and develop statutorily compliant goals for each:

- Community Communication and Engagement
- Infrastructure and Facilities Maintenance
- Financial Transparency and Accountability

Additionally, special districts must provide an annual reporting form to share with the public that reflects whether the goals & objectives were met for the year. District Management has streamlined these requirements into a single document that meets both the statutory requirements for goal/objective setting and annual reporting.

The proposed goals/objectives and the annual reporting form are attached as exhibit A to this memo. District Management recommends that the Board of Supervisors adopt these goals and objectives to maintain compliance with HB7013 and further enhance their commitment to the accountability and transparency of the District.

<u>1. Community Communication and Engagement</u>

Goal 1.1: Public Meetings Compliance

Objective: Hold at least three regular Board of Supervisor meetings per year to conduct CDD related business and discuss community needs.

Measurement: Number of public board meetings held annually as evidenced by meeting minutes and legal advertisements.

Standard: A minimum of three board meetings were held during the Fiscal Year. **Achieved:** Yes \Box No \Box

Goal 1.2: Notice of Meetings Compliance

Objective: Provide public notice of meetings in accordance with Florida Statutes, using at least two communication methods.
